Getting a positive decision on your asylum claim means you have permission to stay in the UK (leave to remain). You will gain new rights.

Documents checklist		
	Check all family members including children have BRP cards	
	Check all details on the asylum decision letter and BRP cards are correct, e.g. date of birth, name, type of leave to remain matches on all documents	
	Take photos of all pages of the decision letter and front and back of the BRP card	
	Keep all documents stored safely, e.g. store copies digitally in your email and cloud storage	
	Keep copies of the letters you received from the Home Office and your asylum support accommodation provider
