Checklist for newlygranted refugees



Getting a positive decision on your asylum claim means you have permission to stay in the UK (leave to remain). You will gain new rights.

What to do after getting leave to remain
Check your documents, e.g. asylum decision letter
Check the date your asylum support ends
Apply for a UK bank account if you don't have one
Apply for benefits if you need to, e.g. universal credit
☐ Apply for homeless support if you have nowhere to live
Register with health services, e.g. GP, dentist
☐ Know your education and employment rights
Documents you need to access your rights:
Asylum decision letter confirming your leave to remain in the UK
Letter from the Home Office telling you how to sign in to your
UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) account and access your
eVisa (an online record of your leave to remain)
☐ Your eVisa once you have accessed it
Asylum support discontinuation letter stating when your ASPEN card payments will stop
☐ Notice to Quit letter from the asylum support accommodation
provider confirming when you have to move out
Application registration card (ARC) when you don't have access to your eVisa

Checklist for newlygranted refugees



(Documents checklist)
☐ Check that all family members including children have eVisa (online record of leave to remain)
Check that all details on the asylum decision letter and eVisa are correct, e.g. date of birth, name, type of leave to remain matches on all documents
Take photos of all pages of the decision letter
Check that you can sign in to your UKVI account and view your eVisa
☐ Check that you can create a share code using the
www.gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status to prove your leave to remain or right to work
Update your UKVI account if you have changed your personal details, e.g. your mobile phone number or email address
Keep all documents stored safely, e.g. store copies digitally in your email and cloud storage
☐ Keep copies of the letters you received from the Home Office and
